Dear friends in Christ,

Looking into February, though short in number, there are many opportunities to engage and enhance our faith and relationship with God and one another. Approaching the season as part of the larger community and with intentionality can help us feel more alive in these winter months, so I hope you'll join us and bring a friend, as we serve God and love our neighbor around the table – the table of Christ, of love, of grace, and forgiveness.

By now, most people have abandoned their new years resolutions. February can invite us more into intention during these potentially long winter months. When we gather as people faith, we are nourished in body, mind, and spirit. I hope you'll join us as we begin the season of Lent –the 40 days leading up to Easter, not counting Sundays – when we gather around Christ's table together, reflecting on Jesus' ministry of fellowship, grace, and radical inclusion.

We begin on Ash Wednesday with something different this year. Join us for a special Ash Wednesday worship service and meal on Wednesday, February 18 at 5:30 p.m. As we gather at table, we will share a meal, share our faith, receive the imposition of ashes, and celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion. To help us plan, please sign up in the narthex or contact the church office by February 15 to let us know you will be attending (include your name, number attending, and any food accommodations – i.e., allergies, vegetarian, etc.).

Throughout Lent, we will continue to gather on Wednesday evenings at 5:30 p.m. (2/25, 3/4, 3/11, 3/18, 3/25) for a simple meal, a brief worship service, and a hands-on service project to benefit others in our community as we seek to be fed and transformed through the example of Jesus' ministry.

The theme for our Lenten season on Sundays at 10 a.m. (2/22, 3/1, 3/8, 3/15, 3/22, 3/29) this year stems from Dr. Marcia McFee, "Listen." I invite you to be present with us as each Sunday as we quiet things down and heighten our attention to the still, small voice of God and our own true self.

I recently read about the importance of listening, and how interesting that the word silent and listen have the same letters, words that go hand in hand. Sunday worship will include listening through prayer, as well as meditation on holy texts is an ancient Lenten practice.

Come and rest, come and listen.

Upcoming Sundays –

Sunday, February 8 – 10 a.m. worship, followed by our annual “Soup”er Bowl Fundraiser to sample soups and sit at table to warm are our bodies and spirits. Bring a friend – soup is only \$10 and is available to go.

Sunday, February 15 – 9 a.m. Sunday School followed by 10 a.m. intergenerational worship that will include blessing of our new altar paraments. We will also be gathering gifts in the narthex for the Laundry Love mission that offers free laundry services, detergent, and quarters to low-income or unhoused residents, fostering community connections at local laundromats. We are collecting laundry detergent, dryer sheets, and cash to support this mission that allows those in need to have the dignity of clean clothes.

Sunday, February 22 – 10 a.m. worship on the first Sunday in Lent

Friends in Christ, join us for Lent to explore re-orienting ourselves toward the Holy. What we pay attention to is what we are formed by, so let us begin this season of listening, of hearing that still, small voice, and finding our own true selves.

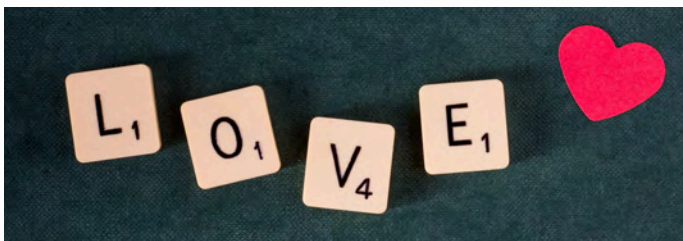
