Pastor's Corner

Which commandment is the first of all? Jesus answered, 'The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." Mark 12:28b-30

Lent (the 40 days before Easter, not including Sundays) begins on Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of a journey of self-reflection and discernment that began back in the 11 th century church.

For the first time in a while, the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday, falls on Valentine's Day. What a fitting time to focus on our love for God. When we look to God for love, and not for the approval of others, we can not only turn ourselves around, but also be an example to the world of how to (re)turn to God.

Some faith traditions begin Lent by giving up something, Here at Grace, at Lent will begin on Valentine's Day, we will be focusing on looking for love in our Christian scriptures. There are many images where love, grace, forgiveness, righteousness, and healing can be found. Not the world's temporary "love" or "good feelings," or "satisfaction." We will look at the stories of Jesus to search for the real deal, real love. Much like last year, on the Wednesdays following Ash Wednesday, we will engage one another in worship, conversation, and a service project to show our love of God through giving love to others. Each of these Wednesdays (see schedule for details), we will begin with sharing a meal at 5:30 p.m. The Sunday School children and their families and the confirmation students will all participate with the congregation and friends of Grace. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to bring a friend! We will be collecting offering to help defer the cost of materials for the service projects. Following a meal, we will have a brief time of worship, followed by a craft or creating a hands-on creation to extend God's love through us to those who may need to hear the Good News. All ages and abilities are encouraged to attend.

How can you be a part? These are several ways to join us in looking for love:

- Come and join us on Wednesday nights or Sunday mornings!
- Provide a meal for one of the Wednesday nights in Lent. There is a signup sheet in the narthex. Meals can be homemade or bought.
- If you have ideas (craft, hands-on creation, or a group to benefit) or would like to help with the creations, contact me.
- Each week, we need someone to relocate the heart-shaped symbol for love to another location in the sanctuary. If you'd like to be a "relocator" (one week or the whole time), please see me.
- Share the invitation with a friend and join us on Sundays or Wednesdays, or both! It's a wonderful way to share love, receive love, and spread love.
- Watch for upcoming details, but here's a little preview to mark your calendar:

Wednesday, February 14th worship at 6:30 p.m. includes imposition of ashes and Holy Communion.

Wednesdays, Feb 21-March 20 begins at 5:30 p.m. with dinner together, followed by worship and a service project.

Sundays, 10 a.m. worship Year round

Sundays* at 8 a.m. worship *First Sunday of the month October through June

Maundy Thursday, March 28 at 6:30 p.m. worship includes Holy Communion. Good Friday, March 29 at 1 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. The evening service will include darkness. Easter Sunday, March 31 worship at 10:00 a.m. will include Holy Communion.

Love is not exclusive to a holiday on the calendar. We love one another because love comes from God. Join us to give, receive, and share the love of God. All are welcome!

Church Council

Hello to my Grace Family!

This is the last note I will be writing as Grace Church Council president, but for sure not the last you will see of me. I plan to remain on the Property Committee, as well as throwing my church council time into getting Extending Grace up and running and an active part of Grace Church.

I am going to take an opportunity to explain to you what church council has meant and done for me.

During the pandemic, none of us had the opportunity to attend church in person and online church just wasn't my thing. It didn't mean I wasn't still making God a part of my daily life, but I fell out of the habit of church. Then when church reopened, I was very slow in returning. Church is a habit, and once you get out of the habit it is very easy to make excuses as to why you aren't going. I did come back a couple times and on one of those occasions, one of the church council members approached me and said there was an opening on council (someone had left before their term was up), and would I consider being on church council. Well, I had every excuse in the book-I'm too busy; I still work full time; I have aging parents and parents in law that I need to be there for, and the list of excuses was long, but I said I'd think about it. I stayed away from church a little longer, but I did think about it. I had been on church council before when I was working full time and still had three kids at home. I knew if I had found the time then, I could do it again. And I could see how our church was struggling. Many people had a hard time returning to the habit of church after COVID.

The next Sunday I was in church, the same person approached me and asked if I had thought about being on church council and I said I had, and I'd be willing to serve again. And so I began a two and a half year term on church council.

There are responsibilities and a time factor that go along with being on church council-I won't lie about that. There are once monthly meetings, helping with communion, planning for some of the "behind the scenes" things that happen at church (i.e. Pastor Beth's absences, Christmas schedule, etc.) and helping with activities that happen at church, but many of you help with those activities already.

Let me tell you what being on church council has DONE for me, though, because it has given me FAR MORE than I have had to give. It has helped me grow as a person in my faith, as well as my leadership skills. It has helped me get back in to the habit of church, which I didn't realize how much I missed until I returned. It has made me more committed to the life of Grace Church than I ever was before because it helped me see what an important part the church plays in the lives of people.

Grace Church has been a part of almost all of the most important days of my life, both happy and sad-my wedding to my husband of 33+ years; the baptism and confirmation of all 3 of my children; and the funerals of all 3 of my grandparents that I had known. Being on church council helped me realize how important Grace has been in my life and the life of my family, but also in so MANY other people's lives. Being on church council is just one small way we can all give back.

Our church is taking some steps towards revitalizing, but in order for that to continue, we need to get more people back in our doors, new people in our doors, and the people who attend pitching in and helping out as much as they are able to. One of those steps towards continuing to grow is keeping a full church council. There is one opening that happened in November, and then my opening that is happening at the end of January as my term ends. NO ONE has stepped forward to fill either of these openings. That leaves a huge burden on the 4 council members that are left. I ask you, I'll even plead with you, to please put your excuses aside and be on church council. I can't promise you it won't take up some of your time, but I can promise it will be a rewarding, enriching experience, and most importantly will help OUR church continue to move forward and thrive.

Thank you for considering giving of your time and talents to Grace Church Council. Even if you step forward after the annual meeting on January 28, whether it be a week or a month down the road, you will be welcomed and appreciated for doing so, and you will get so much in return. Just give it a chance.

Time and Talent - sharing a little history on the quilted cross in the chancel.

My sewing/quilting inspiration comes from a variety of different avenues. My husband, Richard and I have a camper near Fremont and from mid-April to mid-October I join a group of ladies every Friday at a quilt store in Waupaca and we sew together. They have encouraged me, given me ideas and suggestions. They also help to spend my money when new fabric arrives.



I came across this pattern after having talked about Grace's anniversary celebration and spent the summer sewing it together, added the church name and dates to the original pattern, and wondered how I would quilt it. Researching one of my favorite embroidery sites, I came upon a design with doves. How fitting as Grace has a dove with its logo. On closer examination of the quilt, you will notice a dove in each of the corners and a dove at the four corners of the cross. Total completion time about two months. The label on the back reads: "Remembering the Past, Honoring the Present and Welcoming the Future" – an embroidered dove – and signed it "a gift of love by Maureen Faucher."

SEWING — is a passion I have had since middle school. I owe much of my skill and accuracy to my mother who also sewed. She would guide and correct me when my project was not to her standards. I learned to rip and repeat until I got it right.

While sewing, quilting and applique can be tedious, time consuming and test my patience, sewing is my relaxation, a time to create, let my mind wander, and read a book or two while the machine does its thing.

Being able to share my sewing talent with our church family warms my heart.
